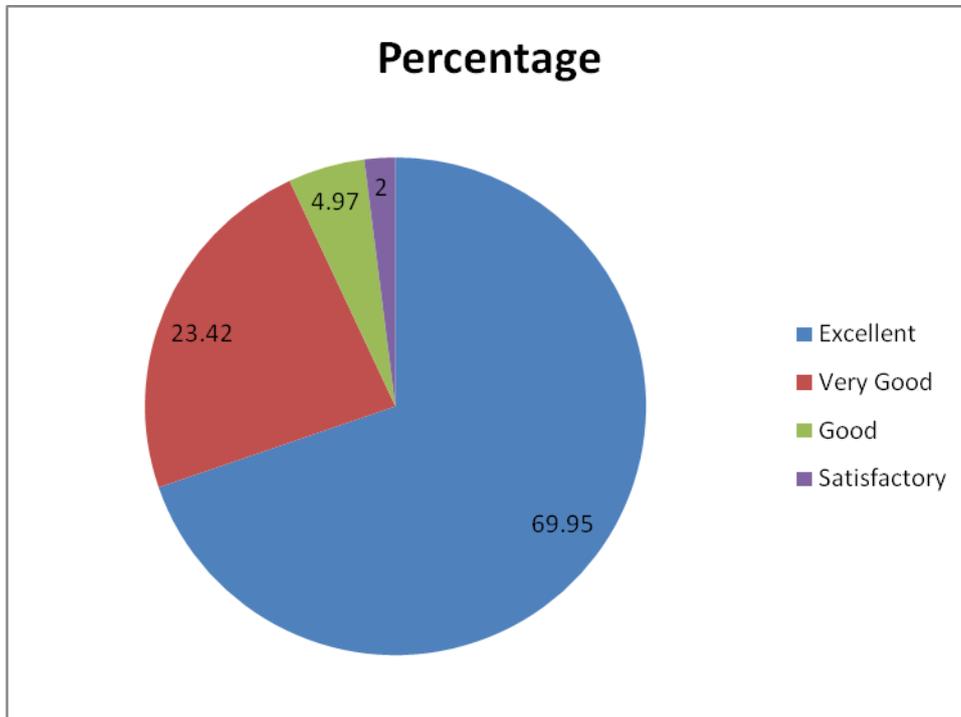

Best Practice – I**Focus on Women Empowerment****Goal:**

In the institution girl students constitute 70% of the total strength. Majority of them come from rural areas, where miserable conditions of poverty, illiteracy and ill-health take hold of their lives. Thus it affects backwardness. So the institution has resolved to take up the cause of Women Empowerment.

Objectives:

Mentoring girl students on women specific issues. Creating environment through awareness programmes to enable the students to realize their full potential for learning and solving their problems independently.

Context:

In the beginning the girl students were not enthusiastic to participate. The staff had to visit certain families and persuade the parents that all the programmes were meant for the betterment and empowerment of the girls so that they can excel.

The Practice:

To achieve the aim, the college has established Women Empowerment Cell that conducts various programmes during the academic year. Women Empowerment cell conducts special training classes for lady students where the college staff provide the coaching that helps them to create self employment. The Department of Commerce has organized Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Workshop on 17th October 2017 and 15th & 16th February 2018.

Evidence of Success:

All the members of the committee are active in the cell. The Staff of the college has extended their helping hands in order to help the girl students to solve their problems. The grievances of the students are redressed by the corresponding cells and committees. Our College Alumni is also helpful in the same process.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

In the beginning there was a grudge in accepting due to misjudgement of this practice but later one of the faculty member took initiative as a resource and guided the other staff who are concerned to this. As this practice is completely cost free and even its implementation is not at all difficult there was no problem encountered.

Best Practice – II**“Spot talk”****Goal:**

Spot talk is when we are given a topic that we did not know beforehand and must give a talk on it without any preparation. The motto of this practice is to make students to speak in the public with confidence. It brings the courage and instant thoughts among the students.

Objectives:

To provide students with the practical skills and knowledge necessary to express themselves clearly with confidence and power in a variety of speaking situations.

Context:

There was a good supportive response from the students in the conduct of spot talk. Due to this practice it has helped the students to remain update and also it has made a change in the student's confidence and courage level.

The Practice:

Whether in a classroom situation students are typically given specific instructions that they must follow.

This has turned as a healthy practice among students as it prepares them for a better tomorrow. Students have accepted it as it has filled courage and confidence among them to come up and talk on the stage facing a good number of audience. Records are maintained by the respective teachers of every class.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Every new thing brings curiosity and a bit of hesitation along with it. In the initial stage students were quite hesitant to come forward. Through the motivation they were convinced to take it up and making it mandatory left them with no choice. As this practice is completely cost free and even its implementation is not at all difficult there was no such major problem encountered.
